



He can still turn radically but can then perch so elegantly with ten toes wrapped. He's literally a surfing chameleon, and regarded as the best longboarder from the Dominican Republic.







You can find some local surf friends located in the north-east as most are from Cabarete - the windsurfing capital of the Caribbean. They work as surf guides, give lessons or offer surfboard rentals at Encuentro, which is really the only beach that's well known here, It's very consistent and has a SurfCam so you can check conditions from anywhere, and with maybe five different reefs right out front it's a good place to make contacts for further adventures, set up lodging, and guide you on some true exploration of this relatively inexpensive version of what is still a true paradise.

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
